VISION & MISSION

Women's Funding Alliance envisions a world where all women and girls have the opportunity to live, lead and thrive. Our mission is to advance leadership and economic opportunity for women and girls in Washington State. We accomplish this by making the case, driving solutions and mobilizing people to make change.

OUR IMPACT

In 2015, Women's Funding Alliance put into a motion our multi-year, strategic plan to advance leadership and economic opportunity for women and girls in Washington State. 2015 marked the implementation of our efforts to make the case, drive solutions and mobilize people to make change.

Together with our committed community of donor activists, grant recipients and partners, we made 2015 the year of foundational impact and growth. In 2015, Women's Funding Alliance:

- Released a comprehensive research report, *The Status of Women in Washington: Forging Pathways to Leadership and Economic Opportunity*, in partnership with the Institute for Women's Policy Research.
- Reached more than half a million people across print, TV, radio, online publications, and social media with the release of the report.
- Made strategic grant investments in 20 innovative organizations working to increase leadership and economic opportunity for women and girls across Washington State.
- Launched the 100% Talent: A Gender Equity Initiative for King County in partnership with the Seattle Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce. This joint effort aims to close the wage gap for women in King County through this voluntary, employer-led, solutions-oriented initiative. Over the next five years, hundreds of companies will sign on in support of the initiative and implement best-practice solutions to increase gender equity.
- Hosted 12 community engagement and Town Hall events across the Puget Sound region, sparking renewed energy and action around our mission and vision.
- Welcomed 16 women in the first cohort of our Young Professionals group. The Women's Funding Alliance Young Professionals play a key role in accomplishing our mission and serve as ambassadors, advisors and advocates of our work.
